**HOMESTEAD HIGH SCHOOL/FRONTIER DAY  
TREATMENT**

**FACT SHEET**

The following information is accurate as of November 1, 2006:

**ENROLLMENT/DAILY ATTENDANCE**

- Currently 94 students are enrolled at Homestead in two separate programs.
- "Regular" School Program: (from 8:05 a.m. to 2:45 p.m.)
  - 68 students enrolled
  - Typically, 48 students attend on any given day. (Many of these students have a long history of poor school attendance. Improving attendance is a goal.)
- Small Group Individual Instruction Program:
  - 26 students enrolled
  - For students who need a unique/creative program
  - Students attend via their IEPs, as follows:

5 students daily	1 student 2X/week
17 students 1x/week	3 students 4x/week

(On the day(s) of attendance, a student stays at school from 1-7 hours.)

**STAFF TO STUDENT RATIO--68 Students in "Regular Daily Classroom Program"**

- 7 Teachers
- 1 VP
- 1 School Psychologist
- 1 School Resource Officer
- 10 Instructional Aides
  - 1 Campus Supervisor
  - 1 Counseling Intern/day

Ratio of 1 staff member to every 4 students.

**OTHER INFORMATION**

- During the 2005-06 school year Homestead sent 13 students back to their home schools for achieving their IEP goals, including maintaining appropriate behavior. All students sent back have done well.

## **FRONTIER DAY TREATMENT**

### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

Frontier Day Treatment is a joint venture between the Grossmont District and County Mental Health (CMH). CMH places students at Frontier which is why there are students from both in and outside of the East County SELPA (Special Education Local Plan Area). The Grossmont District provides the educational portion of the program. CMH provides the therapeutic/counseling portion.

### **CURRENT ENROLLMENT**

- As of November 13, 2006, the enrollment will be 10. Maximum enrollment is 24.
  - Grossmont Union High School District: 4
  - Poway Unified School District: 2
  - San Diego Unified School District: 3
  - Cajon Valley School District: 1

### **TRANSPORTATION**

- Students are transported in school buses or taxis.
