Project Description

This two-story, 35,000 square foot steel-framed classroom building will be clad in stucco and aluminum framed windows with covered walkways at both levels providing shelter to the exterior classroom doors. A freestanding elevator and stair tower creates a new portal to the campus and adds a distinct architectural feature. Adjacent site work will provide new landscaping and accessible pathways.

At completion, students will have 31 state-of-the-art classrooms replacing outdated classroom facilities. Additionally, the project team will construct 10 tennis courts and a Career Technical Education Facility for automotive technology.

Proposition U Bond Program

The new Humanities classroom building project at Grossmont High School is the largest classroom project in the program and is a part of the Proposition U bond measure passed in November 2008 by East County voters. The \$417-million bond measure is budgeted at \$601 million, which includes expected State funding and interest earnings. The bond will continue the modernization of District schools, provide classrooms and equipment for Career Technical Education, and construct a new high school in the Alpine/Blossom Valley area.
